 - b) **Irrigation installation.** This has now been done with many thanks to Richard House for instigating and organising it. The system is now operational and Loreto has done the first scheduled watering for this area.
 - c) **Watering roster.** Thank you to everyone for your assistance with this. Also to Richard Edwards for coordinating the Bridge Point watering. We really appreciate your help there Richard. There are print-outs of the rosters available for those of you who would like one.

 - e) **Richard's Dune book.** A grant has been awarded by the Rotary Club of Encounter Bay for a \$525 contribution towards a revised edition run of 100 books. Rotary are suggesting a cheque presentation with Richard on 11 November in the Esplanade dunes and they are hoping Richard will speak at one of their future meetings. Beach pole measurements updated 11th October and noted low weed level being <10% at all locations. Variations-

Yacht Club- down 10mm

Memorial Park-down 50mm

Willis Street-down 5mm

King Street- up 10mm

Esplanade- down 20mm

Beach pole grant update. Grand application to Coast Protection Board is with Council for review and provision of support letter so we can submit by due date 25th October.

It looks like the pole at the Memorial Gardens is going to be permanently removed as it is in bad condition and could be a risk to the public. The readings from this pole haven't been very informative. There are plans to install another 2 in new locations.

Bottom of Hayward Court steps – Cape Ivy

Further work on this boobialla removing and treating the Cape Ivy. We will be returning again next year to continue to monitor and treat this. Three patches of Livingstone Daisy were removed and the overgrowth impeding walkers down the Hayward steps was cut back.

Pruning and weeding. — We will be giving the area a general tidy-up which will include pruning, weeding and cutting back. Please bring your small or medium garden forks for this bee. Richard Edwards will have all the saws and loppers we will need on the day. Richard House will also be bringing a poison kit in case there is a need for it. Bronson Symmonds will arrange for Council to pick up the prunings on Monday.

ii) Wednesday 8th November WA 16 Bridge Point

 discussions with the City of Victor Harbor for the development of a local Community
 Indigenous Plant Nursery. They are getting great support from the Hindmarsh Island Nursery
 and also the Currency Creek Nursery.
- Loreto Cameron and Richard House have been invited to visit the Hindmarsh Island Nursery by Richard Owen in view of the development of Victor Harbor Bio-Diversity in the future.
- Loreto informs us that Sophie Rawson will be replacing Lee Jeffries position up to June 2024.
- Richard Edwards reports only 1 Hooded Plover chick in the Yacht Club area. He has also noted dwindling supplies of high visibility vests which Andrew Leak will order from the council. 3 x Extra Large, 2 x Large, 3 x Medium and 2 x Small.
