

**MINUTES of the meeting for Victor Harbor Coastcare

Trevor Brand reported on the poor condition of Wright Island being overrun by Box Thorn and roosting pigeons and enquired about the introduction of lizards to control pigeons.

Tina Michell suggested more public education re Gazania control and appropriate plantings for rate payers.

Kathy was thanked for her informative report and presented with a small gift.

- Follow up treatment on the suckering sheoaks on the Bluff.**

Richard House and Loreto Cameron met with Bronson Symmons and Sophie Rawson on the Bluff. Bronson is going to review the area as a whole regarding the Casuarina Glauca problem and will get back to us once he has a plan of how to tackle it. In the mean-time we will continue with follow up treatment on re-growth areas.

The large copse of old suckering sheoaks that we have been treating in conjunction with Council over the last two years will continue and we have agreed to set this up again in April 2024.

It was noticed that a large area directly in front of the picnic setting in front of the first car park had Coastal tee-trees and suckers from the adjacent sheoaks emerging throughout. Bronson will delay cutting/slashing the grass in this area until we have had a working bee to treat as much as possible in this patch. With this in mind, it will be our next working bee on the Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> November.

- Xmas lunch 6.12.2023.** Barb Francis will now send out invitations. Anita and Andrew Leak are organising some drinks.

- Richard House's Dune Book.** The Encounter Bay Rotary club have funded an updated version of Richards Dune Book which VHCC is most grateful for. Thank you to Andrew and Anita Leak who instigated the approach to Rotary for funding this publication. It is a most informative resource for our members.

Richard reports that more 'weeds' have been added to the book as years of clearing Coastal Tea Tree have allowed us to access and see more weed species.

Richard also presented examples of male and female Spinifex for identification.

- Working Kits \$1000 Grant.** For this grant application it was a requirement that Geoff Cope become "an authorised representative of the Applicant" or, if this application is a joint/consortium application, an "authorised representative of the lead organisation"

The Dept of Social Services Grants guidelines state "The authorised representative should be a person who is empowered to enter into contracts and commitments on behalf of the Applicant."

*Motion* Geoff Cope is authorised to complete required work for grant applications and undertake direct contact with stakeholders to implement mutually beneficial arrangements, subject to keeping the Chairperson informed during and on completion of an application.

## 8. Beach Pole Report

Beach pole measurements updated on 13th November as follows.

Yacht Club- increase 10mm

Memorial Park- decrease 10mm

Willis St- increase 10mm

King St- no change

Esplanade- increase 10mm

Weed level remains relatively low at around 10%

We note the although dune height has not changed significantly at the 3 Willis, King and Esplanade locations there is an increase to the surrounding vegetation and that is slowly building dune volumes.

## **9. Working bees**

### **a) Work done.**

#### **i) Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> October WA 16 Bridge Point**

Pruning and weeding. Bridge Point has had a good tidy up. Bowls were dug around recent plantings and the area prepared for mulching.

#### **ii) Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> November WA 16 Bridge Point**

Mulching. 2 loads delivered by Council and spread over old and new plantings. Richard Edwards pruned plants overhanging path areas and Trevor and Richard removed Coastal Tea-trees they found, also, a cache of succulents that had been dumped under shrubs nearby which were then removed.

### **b) Work planned.**

#### **i) Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> November WA 1C The Bluff**

We will be working through the patch directly in front of the 1<sup>st</sup> carpark picnic area, locating Coastal Tea-trees and small Suckering Sheoaks and treating them. We will endeavour to cover as much as possible of this area before Council come and slash/cut for the summer. If we finish this area early, we will then continue treatment on re-growth where the contractor was working last summer.

**It was agreed that if the temperature is forecast to be high, that Loreto will send an email asking for a 0900 start instead of 1000. Please check your emails the night prior to the working bee.**

#### **ii) Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> December WA Kings Beach Lookout area**

This area is in need of a general tidy-up ready for the summer. Loreto will arrange the water cart for this working bee so we can give it a good ‘once-over’. It will be a lovely spot to end our working year with morning tea looking over this beautiful bay.

#### **iii) Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> January 2024 – WA 11 Causeway Dunes – Weeding around the new plantings and treating the Tamarisks.**

#### **iv) Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> February 2024 – WA 11 Causeway Dunes – General weeding focussing on Euphorbias in the area and treating the Tamarisks.**

## **10. Other Business**

- a) New Dog By-Laws.** Loreto Cameron received a call from Michael Quinton asking that VHCC members review the latest by-laws installed by VH Council regarding dog control around both the two river estuaries and the lagoon area which is such a fragile environment. He asked if we could perhaps endorse these controls on the VHC website under “Have your say” and the survey attached. We witnessed the Council trying to get the correct message across regarding this matter at our last working bee.
- b) Biodiversity Victor Harbor.** Richard Owen from Hindmarsh Island Landcare Group has issued an invitation to all who are interested to attend a propagation working bee at his nursery on the 21<sup>st</sup> November. There are a few who will be attending this informative activity, please let Loreto Cameron know if you are going to attend and she will notify them of our numbers on the day. Currently Loreto, Tina, Anita, Andrew and Janine are attending.
- c) Annual Coastcare week 4-10 December.** Anita Leak will write an article for the local papers, including interviews of members and their experiences of Coastcare and ‘Seeds for Snapper’ Tina Michell will aid Anita with this. Loreto has forwarded the correspondence received about this on to all of our members regarding the volunteer information session to be held on the 30<sup>th</sup> November in Encounter Bay for ‘OzFish’ and their community driven project collecting the seagrass seeds again this year.
- d) Bridge Point signage maintenance and update.** Richard House has very generously offered to update and replace all of the signage at Bridge Point, he will also match up the little plaques with the larger sign and replant those plants that are no longer there but are on the signage. Many thanks for attending to this Richard. Trevor Brand suggested planting some native grasses in this area.
- e) Bronson Symmons and Sophie Rawson** have supplied us with the planting list for VHCC to install during the planting season of 2024. They have asked for feedback regarding the plants and areas selected. Trevor and Richard House will review and get back to Loreto.
- f) Anita Leak** will supply a Christmas themed morning tea for our last working bee for 2023. Thanks as always Anita.

- g) **David Thorn** reports that only 1 Hooded Plover fledgling has survived in the area between Goolwa to Deep Creek. The surviving one was from a nest in front of the Croquet club. There were a total of 16 pairs of Plovers with 31 nests. High tides and swells, magpies and foxes have all contributed to their demise.
- h) **Richard Edwards** has reported to the council that trees are being axed down in the Tom Stevens reserve at the Hindmarsh River
  - i) **Equipment Purchases.** Loreto Cameron suggests that members think about any further purchases of equipment for the new year. Richard Edwards has suggested perhaps a Whipper Snipper.
