1. Welcome and Present

Update

- Rabbit Control was completed in February, with great uptake of the K5 treated carrots along Oliver's Parade, G.S Read and at the Bluff.
- Ongoing weekly litter pick up in the dunes at the Youth Park, left of the causeway cafe, Soldiers Memorial reserve and around the car parks at the Bluff Reserve.
- Ongoing watering of last season's plants at the Youth Park dunes, G.S Read Reserve, Kent Reserve dunes, Franklin Parade dunes and in the Bluff Reserve.
- Temporary fence put up at Kent reserve to stop cars accessing the beach through the dunes. Fencing along GS- Recycle plastic post and galvanized rail- extension no time frame.
- Investigator Toilet block project is still ongoing.
- Yandra storm water outlet was upgraded and revegetated. A storm eroded parts of this project. New fence installed.
- Council staff had its first Clean Up Australia day at the oval.
- New plant identification signage ordered for Bridge Tce garden

Weed Control

- Feathertop grass control (*sprayed & seed head removed*) along the Jetty Rd at the Bluff.
- Several Gazania and Boneseed plants removed from Hindmarsh River Estuary.
- Young Olives basal sprayed at the Bluff Reserve, on the left just before the first carpark.
- Small coastal tea-trees removed from G.S Read reserve.
- Actively removing Scabiosa from Kent Reserve dunes around last season's plantings.
- Aloes have been popping up along Franklin Parade and removed when observed.
- Large shrubs of Dolichos pea have been removed along Oliver's Parade (near Yandra).
- Oliver's Parade- weed control program for this financial year completed. Contractor weed control this financial year along this stretch
- Seeds for Snapper program wrapped up this year with no seed washing up through the period.
- Coastal monitoring program- will be completed in June 30th with assessment of the coast PhD student- "Coastal Dynamics" focuses on Victor Harbor's reefs and interaction with the coast 3.5 year. Currently looking for a PhD student.

Looking for a Biodiversity and conservation school-based student. 3 year one day a week

- Investigator Stair Installation 2 x staircases to commence works. Commence prior to Easter.
- Alexandra Street. We have purchased materials for the project and are finalizing the contract to deliver the works.
- Bluff Masterplan Project -stage one detailed design is at about 70% completion and looking to start on ground works prior to June 30th. This includes car park upgrades, signage upgrades and path closures, seating, lookout etc. and also revegetation which VHCC will be approached to assist with.

- David Thorn queried the possibility of more permanent fencing for Hooded Plover protection near the Croquet Club. Andrew Comas to be contacted concerning this.

9. Working bees

a) Work done.

i) Sunday 25th February 2024 – WA 14 - Sea Rescue Squadron

A very productive day. Continuation of the removal of euphorbia following on from the area we were previously in, heading towards Bridge Point. This was a good morning's work; also, we located an olive, coastal tea-tree and the 'wild gladi' area which has been marked for later in the year.

ii) Wednesday 13th March 2024 - WA 11 Causeway Dunes

Visit to the CoastSnap site with demonstration by Geoff Cope and Leucopogon parviflorus identified by Richard House.

Tamarisk control once more, as well as clearing the area ready for some re-vegetation in the winter months.

Richard House presented a photo of a recent tree stump with drill holes to demonstrate how the holes need to be drilled closer to the bark area in the 'cambium' layer to be more effective. Also 360 degrees of drilling needs to be done to prevent shooting in any undrilled area.

b) Work planned.

i) Sunday 24th March 2024 – WA 10 – Causeway Dunes

From King Street towards Inman River mouth – weed removal – beginning at the dripper tap location and heading towards the Inman removal of gazanias, euphorbia, scabiosa and anything else that crops up along this stretch.

Loreto will be unavailable for this working bee, Jen Priddle and Richard Edwards will lead the team that day.

ii) Wednesday 10th April 2024 – WA1G - The Bluff Slope

Removal of more Suckering Sheoaks from the old copse - We will once again be working with Council who will be cutting and macerating the selected trees while Victor Harbor Coastcare treat the remaining stumps.

Melaleucas Amaryllis has been identified here and Loreto will approach Bronson Symmonds concerning this.

- c) Hooded Plovers –David Thorn

At the moment there is only one 24 day old chick at the Croquet Club, The last remaining chick at the Inman River site was lost in the hot weather of the long weekend and the triathlon activities.

Statistics for the Victor Harbor Council area:-

4 nesting sites, 4 pairs of Hooded Plovers, 61 eggs laid, 21 nests, 6 chicks hatching, 1 of those chicks fledging and 1 chick at 24 days old at the Croquet Club site. Loreto Cameron:-

I mistakenly referred to the terns last meeting as 'little terns' when in fact they are crested terns, and it looks like the numbers have doubled since our last meeting. The little terns have been listed as vulnerable in SA.

I believe the numbers of penguins fledged this season has been raised to 25. A great result. I also will mention that I sent a letter to the Compliance team at Victor Harbor Council regarding dogs chasing and attacking shore birds, and that there needed to be more education regarding this on both the Council and public sides. I hadn't heard anything back and was a little disheartened, as Monday morning, I saw a man standing on the shoreline looking on while his collie dog stalked and then pounced on both herons and egrets. Well, Monday afternoon I got a phone call back from the Manager of the Council Compliance team who told me that there are going to be more patrols along all the beaches between 8 and 10am for an extended period of time. If anyone witnesses anything reportable, they are to be contacted, even after hours. Council are making a concerted effort with this problem.

- d) Junior Coastcarers this looks to be taking place on 18th April, thanks to Geoff, Jen and Janine for taking this project on for Victor Harbor Coastcare which involves planting 20 propagated pigface by Richard House on one side of the boat ramp area. Victor Harbor Coastcare will be revegetating here also as it has been hammered over the summer period by holidaymakers cutting through the back of the dune with their cars and destroying the dune. Council are going to block it with bollards or similar and we will then install replacement plants. Update Council have already put in stakes and wire to deter vehicles.
