8. Beach Pole Report

Measurements were completed on 13th April. Relatively small variations with exception of Memorial Park.

Yacht Club - no change Memorial Park- decrease 230mm Wills St- increase 10mm King St- increase 10mm The Esplanade - decrease 10mm

The Memorial Park variation was significant but followed a day with relatively vigorous seas with high swell and tide. There was a similar event in around May 2023 and sand levels returned to normal levels in the following months.

Weed levels were generally low on the Yacht Club side on the causeway. There were large clumps of weed from the area that we worked on tamarisk down to the Wills St beach pole. A large amount of weed has also accumulated at Encounter Bay.

i) Sunday 24th March 2024 - WA 10 - Causeway Dunes

Weed removal from King Street towards the Inman River mouth. Olive, buckthorn, palms and mirror bushes were all removed beside euphorbia. Bill and Trevor worked on tamarisk regrowth while Derek tackled an acacia cyclops. Thank you to Richard Edwards and Jen Priddle for standing in for me that day.

ii) Wednesday 10th April 2024 - WA 1G The Bluff Slope

Removal of more Casuarina Glauca from the old copse - Council staff cut down 8 more of these. There are only 7 remaining, which we will endeavour to do this time next year. The small copse nearby was checked and emerging suckers treated as well as several small melaleuca armillaris. 3-4 of the larger melaleuca armillaris were cut down by the council team, who are going to return to complete the job when they can.

i) Sunday 28th April 2024 - WA 10 Causeway Dunes

Continuation from the last working bee which ended in front of King Street weeding gazania, euphorbia etc. Please bring a garden fork or similar to assist you in the removal of these weeds. We will also have a supply with us should anyone need anything.

ii) Wednesday 8th May 2024 - WA 40 Investigator Dunes

Beginning from in front of the car park dunes, we will be concentrating on the removal of gazania, euphorbia and other weeds heading in a line towards the Hindmarsh River Estuary.
